Independent Book Publishers Association (IBPA) Announces Gold Winners in the 29th Annual IBPA Benjamin Franklin Awards™ for Excellence in Book Publishing

(Manhattan Beach, CA – April 12, 2017) — The Independent Book Publishers Association (IBPA) – <u>www.ibpa-online.org</u> – announced over the weekend the gold winners in their prestigious IBPA Benjamin Franklin Awards™, now in its twenty-ninth year.

This year's esteemed indie book award program recognized excellence in books published during calendar year 2016. From close to 1,400 entries, one gold winner was named in each of fifty-five categories. Silver winners were also named in each category, for a total of 169 overall winners.

The gold winners were announced on Friday, April 7, 2017 during a gala dinner ceremony programmed at the end of the first day of IBPA's **Publishing University**, a two-day conference with over 30 educational and networking sessions developed to foster collaboration within the independent publishing community. Both the dinner ceremony and the conference took place at the Historic Benson Hotel in Portland, Oregon.

"Becoming a Benjamin Franklin Award finalist showcases a publisher's commitment to professional standards and high-quality book content and production," said Angela Bole, IBPA's Chief Executive Officer. "Winning can expand a book's marketability and solidify a publisher's credibility – two very powerful things in today's crowded book market."

For nearly 30 years, the IBPA Benjamin Franklin Awards[™] have been regarded as one of the highest national honors for small and independent publishers. This year's gold winners include a variety of books from independent publishers large and small, hybrid presses, self-published authors, and major national groups like the American Cancer Society and The White House Historical Association.

According to Jim Milliot at *Publishers Weekly* in an article published April 10, 2017, among the many heartfelt acceptance speeches during the dinner ceremony was that of Joseph Jenkins, author and publisher of *The Slate Roof Bible, Third Edition: Everything You Need to Know about the World's Finest Roof*. The book took gold in the reference category. "I am pretty sure I am the only roofer here tonight," said Jenkins, who has been writing and publishing for more than two decades. He said that winning the award was one of the highlights of his career.

Over 150 librarians, booksellers, and design and editorial experts – most of whom have decades of book industry experience – judge the books submitted to the IBPA Benjamin Franklin Awards™. The judging process takes close to six months, beginning in September and continuing into March each year. At the end of the process, every entrant receives written critiques from the three individual judges who reviewed their book. The critiques include constructive feedback to help each publisher understand how their book is being perceived by industry professionals, upholding part of IBPA's mission to serve the independent publishing community through education.
